

Low incidence services are defined as those provided to the student population who have orthopedic impairment (OI), visual impairment (VI), who are deaf, hard of hearing (HH), or deaf-blind (DB). Typically, services are provided in educational settings by an itinerant teacher or an itinerant teacher/specialist. Consultation is provided to the teacher, staff, and parents as needed. These services must be clearly written in the student's IEP, including frequency and duration of the services to the student. While we have students in our population that have these disabilities, their educational needs are currently being met under other service codes.

Qualifications of the Provider Delivering "Other Related Service"

Other special education/related services: These specialized services in Auditory Therapy are provided to Deaf/DHOH students who required individual services to train listening skills and interpretation of the incoming hearing aide/chochlear implant signals. This service is provided by an individual certified in Auditory Therapy.
