Call to Order -

Randy Dhindsa called the meeting to order at 9:01a.m. Randy welcomed everyone to the first DAC meeting of the 2019-2020 school year. All attendees were asked to sign in and introductions were made around the room.

The Video “3 Generations Answer the Same Questions” was presented. Group conversations followed. The video will be shared.

<p>After watching the video, parents requested the link, so they can share with their SSC members at school sites. This brought up discussions on how to balance between using technology for social and schoolwork.</p>	<p>Comments</p>
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<p><u>Purpose of Forming DAC</u> Collect valuable information from the district for the school, to inform about basic law, LCAP, Categorical Programs and the purpose for the committee. Information that we provide, members should take back to the SSC meeting at school site one important responsibility of DAC is to help with input for the LCAP.</p> <p><u>Student Achievement Presentation – Robb Christopherson, Ed.D.</u> California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) Smart Balance (SBAC) students from grades 3-8 and 11 take in Math and ELA. Presentation of 3 years of data was reviewed. 73% of all students met or exceeded the standard in ELA. 59% of all students met or exceeded the standard in Math.</p> <p><u>Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP)</u> LCAP first adopted on July 1, 2014. It is a three-year plan that is updated annually. We are in our second term of the LCAP 3-year plan (2017-2020). This partnership is between school, parents and students. Plan is aligned to our CUSD strategic plan. LCAP funding is based on our unduplicated counts of EL, Low Income, Foster Youth and Homeless students.</p> <p>Annual updates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Increase social-emotional and behavioral support. • Expand Career Technical Education courses by supporting high schools’ allocated personnel. • Enhance safety and security resources at the elementary level. • All existing Actions and Services remain in place. <p>Timelines: January 27, 2020 – LCAP Parent Advisory meeting to share data and seek feedback February 2020 – Writing Team updates LCAP template February-March 2020 – Site and Department meetings with Stakeholders March 2020 – Writing Team develops the Draft LCAP March 30, 2020 – LCAP Parent Advisory Meetings to discuss and review the Draft LCAP May 5, 2020 – LCAP Parent Committee Meeting (DAC, DELAC, FY) May 6, 2020 – CUSD Governing Board schedules a public hearing and receives the Draft LCAP May 20, 2020 – LCAP public hearing is held; LCAP public comment period ends May-June 5, 2020 – Writing team finalizes CUSD LCAP June 10, 2020 – Governing Board receives recommendations for CUSD LCAP July 1, 2020 – LCAP due to Fresno County Superintendent of Schools Fall 2020 – Annual Update and LCAP Review</p> <p><u>Program Business</u> Randy Dhindsa reviewed Roberts rules of order and each attendee was presented a copy. Minutes will be taken by Kym McMills and emailed to you. Including any handouts or documents (i.e. PowerPoint, videos etc.). Minutes from the May 3, 2019 were distributed and read individually by those in attendance. A motion was made by Tischa Coffman and seconded by Vivek Prabhu. Motion carried; minutes were approved. By-Laws were reviewed and first motion approved by Ruby Helsley and seconded by Nicole Jenkins.</p> <p><u>District Information:</u> Randy Dhindsa and Bob Kampf SSC reviews and approves the state and federal funding. Not all schools receive all funds, they are based upon the students they serve. 17 Title I Schools meet criteria based on the number of students receiving free and reduced lunch. Title I Part A funds are district level funds used by Student Services who directly assist families in need. Migrant students are decreasing in the district. These students are qualified based on the work their parents do. Title III money serves English Learners. ASES Programs are offered at each Title I Elementary School sites. The District funds the remaining Title I School sites. 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oversee these programs. Homework academic enrichment, Intervention – arts and crafts – STEM, healthy fitness and a healthy snack. Discussion about the Parent Academy and the different ways parents and schools can work together to help parents and students.

Bob Kampf presented and explained the Schools’ SARC’s. He demonstrated how parents and community members may view the report on the CUSD website. Schools in California must complete a SARC on an annual basis and share it with their community. He noted that if anyone would like a copy of their school site’s SARC to let him know or they can come to the office or request a copy at their site.

Board policy #7502, 7507, 9203 were reviewed with committee. Each member received a copy of board policies in their packet.

Randy Dhindsa presented Uniform Complaint procedure policy was reviewed and discussed – Board Policy 9208, 9211

Randy Dhindsa asked members to take a few moments to complete the Needs Assessment in their packet. The result will be reviewed at the next meeting on February 25, 2020 at the PLC. The information is used for future meeting presentations.
