

Peer Counseling is an A-G requirement and is a college preparatory readiness class. The Peer Counseling Program offers support services to peers. It is an effective tool for providing prevention, intervention, and referral services to individuals experiencing difficulties.

- **Effectively trained Peer Counselors can positively influence the attitudes and behaviors of their peers.**

Peer Counselors go through a semester of training before running sessions students. Students learn:

- The session introduction with the duties to inform.
- Not passing judgement.
- Compassion and empathy.
- Positive non-verbal's.
- Paraphrasing for understanding and feelings.
- Open & closed ended questions.
- Guiding the counselee to options without giving advice.
- Everything is confidential unless harm to self or others.

Students can refer themselves or others for a PC session. Teachers, staff, and parents can also refer students for a PC session.

Clovis Unified has Peer Counseling programs in every High School and Intermediate school.

Mediator Mediators is expanding into Elementary Schools across the district.

Peer Counselors Don't:

- Give advice.
- Tell other people or teachers about what we talk about unless it is harm to self or others.
- Judge you or what you're going through.
- Lie to you or give you false information.
- Run therapy sessions and tell you what to do.
- Portray themselves as being better than everyone else.
