Enroll Today!

Each child wishing to enroll in the Clovis Unified Title VI Native American Indian Education Program is required to submit a completed *506 Indian Student Eligibility Certification Form*. This completed form should be submitted to your child's school site or the Supplemental Services Office for consideration. After review, the child can be enrolled in the program and considered for additional instructional support as well as being included in our programs quarterly newsletters. Enrollment in our program also offers our students and their families an invitation to the Annual Native American Family Night.

Eligible students include:

- A member of an Indian Tribe or Band including Tribes or Bands terminated since 1940 and those recognized by the state in which the Tribe or Band resides.
- Descendent in the first or second degree (parent or grandparent)
- Considered by the Secretary of the Interior to be Indian, Eskimo or Aleut.

Parent Advisory Committee

The Parent Advisory Committee provides input and feedback relative to the Title VI Program and The Annual Needs Assessment for Parents. The Advisory Committee meets four times a year to discuss program updates, services provided, and other needs related to student achievement. The Committee consists of parent and student representatives.
